## WELCOME TO CAMP!


Dear GSGLA Girl Scouts and Girl Scout Families:

# GIRL SCOUT CAMP PROPERTY HIGHLIGHTS



## CAMP OSITO RANCHO

This premier Girl Scout Outdoor Leadership Center is a spectacular 160-acre high adventure mountain camp located at 7,500 feet in the San Bernardino Mountains above Big Bear Lake. Activities include swimming, archery, sports, a variety of games, nature and environmental activities, challenge/ropes course, hiking, outdoor cooking, canoeing, horseback riding, and arts and crafts.

## EL RANCHITO

El Ranchito is an outdoor, park-like property at GSGLA's Long Beach Service Center that includes outdoor and indoor sleeping accommodations. El Ranchito will host weeklong themed day camps.

## MONTROSE PROGRAM CENTER

Montrose Program Center is located in Montrose, a small foothill community in the San Gabriel Valley. This center features a charming outdoor space with a deck and a campfire circle.

## JOHNSTONE PROGRAM CENTER

Johnstone Program Center's tree-filled park setting nestled in San Dimas offers a backdrop for wonderful outdoor activities and adventures. This is a great environment for girls to get a taste of camp.

## MARINE LANDING

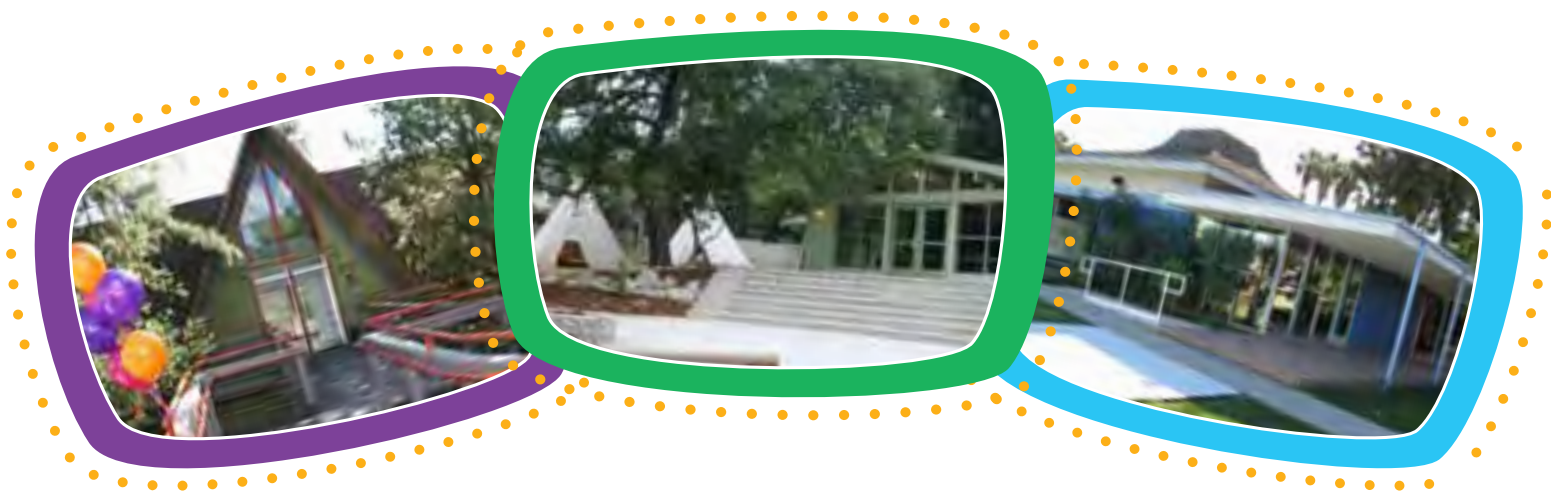
Located on Alamitos Bay in Long Beach, Marine Landing is a one-of-a-kind waterfront facility offering a private boating beach, charming boathouse and beautiful sea views. Day camp sessions will include boating and marine activities, as well as swim and playtime at the beach.

## SKYLAND RANCH

Located in a pine and oak tree forest near Idyllwild, Skyland Ranch offers girls a chance to explore the beautiful San Jacinto Mountains. This property encompasses 195 acres of pine and oak forests, chaparral and apple orchards. The camp will host several overnight camp sessions.

## CAMP MARIPOSA

Camp Mariposa is a cozy camp in the foothills of Altadena in the San Gabriel Valley. It includes a wooded area with a small pond and a campfire ring with an adjacent amphitheater. The camp will host weeklong themed day camps.



## WHEN TO REGISTER

Registration for summer camp programs begins February 15, 2011. Registrations will be processed in the order they are received. You will be notified if your first-choice camp session is full. If so, your second-choice camp session will be registered at the time of receipt of the registration.

## HOW TO REGISTER

Registrations may be completed online at [girlscoutsla.org](http://girlscoutsla.org), and this is the encouraged method for registering. It's fast, easy, and your deposit or full payment can be made securely (VISA, MasterCard, Discover, American Express). Camp Registration Forms are also accepted via regular mail or by dropping them off at one of our seven service centers (locations with addresses can be found on the GSGLA website listed above). Deposits are required for all day camps, resident camp and for many of our core camps (if not paying in full). **These are non-refundable and non-transferable between camps.** Please note that deposits are required for each session. Resident camp session deposits are \$95 each. Day camp session deposits are \$25 each. If submitting your deposit(s) by mail and paying by check or money order, please make it payable to: Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles. There is a \$35 service charge for returned checks.

Campers who wish to attend a camp session together need to follow the instructions on page 6 under the question "Can my camper be in the same unit as her friend?" Please note that it is not possible to guarantee placement of more than two friends together in any session.

**Camp fee balances are due four weeks prior to the opening day of your Girl Scout's camp session.** If registering for a camp session within the four weeks prior to the start date, full payment is required.

If your daughter is not a currently registered Girl Scout at the time of camp registration, the \$12 GSUSA membership fee will be added to her camper fee.

## REGISTRATION VS. CONFIRMATION

**Although a girl may be registered for a camp, she is not officially placed into the camp session until the minimum required numbers for that session are achieved.** As soon as this occurs, confirmation packets are mailed to all participants registered to date. These packets include all relevant information for that camp. For resident camp this includes: confirmed session, dates, program details, bus stop location, a suggested equipment list, health forms and insurance information. **Note:** No confirmation packets will be mailed prior to March 15, 2011.

## REFUND POLICY

Registrations are determined on a first-come, first-served basis. If your daughter's selected camp session is full and no alternative can be found, or if the application for financial aid is not approved, then you will receive a full refund for any deposit or fees paid. **Deposits are otherwise non-refundable.** The balance of any remaining camp fees will only be refunded if:

- Family plans change and the camper can no longer attend (written notification must be received four weeks before the opening date of the confirmed camp session).
- The camper cannot attend due to illness or injury (a physician's letter must accompany the refund request).
- The camper is sent home from camp due to illness or injury occurring at camp (refunds are prorated in such cases and will not be made for less than half of the camp session and will be made only at the written request of the parent). No refunds will be made if a camper leaves a session early for any other reason.

Refund requests must be in writing and submitted no later than August 15, 2011 to the address listed under the "How to Register" section.



# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## WHO OWNS AND OPERATES THE CAMPS?

Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles owns and operates three large resident camps in the Greater Los Angeles Area: Camp Osito Rancho in Big Bear, Camp Lakota in Frazier Park and Camp Skyland Ranch near Idyllwild. GSGLA also operates several unique program sites that host day and core camps (listed on our property highlights page). While many camps are held at GSGLA-owned facilities, GSGLA has partnerships with non-Girl Scout facilities to host specialty camping opportunities created to best meet the varying interests of girls. GSGLA program staff work directly with these partners when offering a camp experience through our organization.

## DO I HAVE TO BE A GIRL SCOUT TO ATTEND CAMP?

Any girl who meets the age and developmental requirements for a camp can register! If not currently a Girl Scout, girls simply need to have a parent/guardian complete the registration form and submit the annual membership fee of \$12. As a member, girls can participate in the various council-sponsored programs offered across the greater Los Angeles area. Girl Scouting is open to every girl regardless of race, ethnicity, religion or ability. Our program activities, whenever possible, accommodate girls with special needs.

## ARE THERE AGE LIMITS FOR CERTAIN CAMPS?

Yes, and they are dependent on the camping experience being offered. Please check the camp description for grade limitations. **Note: Grades indicated refer to the fall 2011 school year, the grade into which a girl will be entering.**

## IS FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE?

Yes, for girls whose family's socioeconomic situation might otherwise not allow them to attend camp. A campership application for resident camp, day camps or the various core camps that are offered can be found at the end of this Camp Guide. Camperships are limited and based on documented financial need as indicated on the application. **Note: Camp Registration and Campership Application are two different forms.**

## WILL MY CAMPER NEED A PHYSICAL EXAMINATION TO ATTEND CAMP?

For resident camps, yes. Each camper is required to have a physical examination within 24 months of the starting day of her scheduled camp session. A Health History Form is required for all campers and must be completed no more than two months prior to the camper's session. The form will be included in the camper confirmation packets and is available for downloading at [www.girlscoutsla.org](http://www.girlscoutsla.org).

## WHAT IF MY CHILD NEEDS MEDICAL OR SPECIAL ATTENTION WHILE AT CAMP?

Resident camp has a qualified professional health supervisor on site, and all camps have First Aid certified adults on site at all times who administer routine health care and any medications. An emergency contact plan is in place should any medical emergencies occur. Parents are notified as soon as possible in the event of any special medical or emergency situation. If your camper has any special needs (physical, behavioral, etc.), every effort will be made to accommodate her special needs. Please include any past or potential concerns on the health history form. The camp director will contact you prior to your daughter's session.

## CAN SPECIAL FOODS BE PROVIDED?

Most special dietary needs can be met if camp directors are notified in advance. At resident camp, meal options due to medical, religious, or other reasons are available. Please indicate these requirements on your camper's Health History form. Vegetarian alternatives are offered at every meal.





## CAN MY CAMPER BE IN THE SAME UNIT AS HER FRIEND?

We do our best to place friends together if they meet the following criteria: they are in the same program level and registered for the same camp session (not just the same camp program); requested friend placements are indicated on BOTH campers' registration forms with the word "Friend" printed on the top right corner of the applications; if possible, mail both registration forms in together—or contact the registrar to inform her/him of the friend's name.

## WHAT ARE CAMP STAFF LIKE?

Camp staff are enthusiastic, fun, caring, energetic, well-trained, and often highly experienced individuals who are hired or appointed for their desire to work with children in a learning environment. For many core camps, volunteers play an important role along with staff. Both hired and volunteer staff complete at least minimum requirements of training hours for their respective roles.

American Camp Association accreditation for resident camp requires training for all resident camp staff on topics including youth supervision, child development, program planning, conflict resolution, First Aid, CPR and additional certification for specialized program delivery. The resident camp ratio of staff to campers is 1 to 6, with a ratio of 1 to 4 for high-risk programs. The day camp ratio is 1 to 10, and for aquatic activities, it is 1 to 8.

## WHAT CAMP HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS ARE MAINTAINED?

All GSGLA camps meet the health and safety standards and guidelines established by Girl Scouts of the USA and the State of California. Copies of any required California Health Department's inspections are kept on file at the council office.

## WHAT IS A CIT?

*Counselors in Training* are older Girl Scouts, Grades 9–12, who are taking CIT training and work at resident camp as assistant counselors. This provides them with advanced outdoor group leadership experience and skill training.

## WHO ARE PROGRAM AIDES?

Program Aides are Girl Scouts, Grades 7–12, who are interested in working with younger girls, sharing their knowledge and talents while gaining valuable experience under adult supervision, have completed the required training hours, and have registered for camp PA programs. They earn community service and leadership hours satisfying school volunteer and Girl Scout leadership requirements. # RESIDENT CAMP

## CAMP OSITO RANCHO RESIDENT CAMP

Located in Big Bear, this beautiful resident camp property offers girls camp sessions that encourage girl planning and provide opportunities for girls to experience crafts, swimming, archery, sports and games, hiking, a challenge/ropes course, outdoor cooking—and of course, nature! Every day is a new adventure and every night sky offers new chances to wish upon a star... or the constellations! Skill level, weather, and group planning determine a girl's ability to participate in certain activities. **Bus transportation to and from resident camp from several of GSGLA's service centers is included in the cost of the sessions.** More information will be provided in the camp packet forwarded with the camp registration confirmation. Personal flotation devices are provided for all canoeing.

## HORSE SESSIONS

The equestrian staff works with campers in group sessions, instructs Western riding and provides individual attention based on a camper's skill-level as a rider. Beginner, intermediate and advanced riders are encouraged to attend; all sessions include horse care, saddling and riding instruction. Riders must wear boots with a ½ inch heel to ensure safety in the stirrups; this is an American Camp Association standard and a Girl Scout requirement.

All Horse Sessions include a night time "glow stick" ride: decorate your horse and experience trail riding under the stars! While much of the time at camp will be focused on horse-related activities, girls will also be able to take advantage of other camp activities.

## HORSE HUGS

A perfect introduction to horses for younger Girl Scouts. Spend time at the corral brushing and caring for the horses and circle the arena on horseback during rein-led rides!

## HORSE WHISPERERS

## CAMP ACCREDITATION

Camp Osito Rancho is accredited by the American Camp Association (ACA). Every three years the camp goes through an accreditation process with on-site visits to evaluate and verify compliance with a set of national standards established by professionals in the camping industry. This is an action we take voluntarily. The standards establish guidelines for needed policies, procedures and practices in the administration of key aspects of camp safety management.

## PROGRAM ADJUSTMENTS

The council and camp directors reserve the right to reassign a camper from one program to another if she does not meet the minimum skill level required for her selected program.

Every effort will be made to help all campers adjust to camp. The Camp Director or Environment & Outdoor Adventure Program Manager will notify parents of changes. The council and camp directors reserve the right to send a camper home should the need arise.



# DAY CAMPS

## EL RANCHITO

El Ranchito in Long Beach offers an exciting adventure every week! At this beautiful tree-filled, park-like day camp, girls are grouped by grade level in shaded units. Girls will explore traditional Girl Scout activities such as games, crafts, interacting with nature and making new friends. All day camps include daily snacks, Friday lunch, a camp T-shirt or bag, a camp patch, and a 4x6-inch group picture.

**Extended Care:** Before Camp Care is available from 7 to 9 a.m. and After Camp Care is available from 3 to 6 p.m. for \$25 each per week. Girls will participate in unstructured play and activities.

**Summer Program Aides:** Girls must have completed Program Aide Core and Camp Specialty Training prior to the first summer session. PAs are assigned to units and work closely with counselors and campers.
