Camp Hours: Regular camp hours are from 9:00am to 4:00pm Monday-Friday. You can purchase Extended Care at any time through your MyGS profile.



Directions: See the map above. We can be easily reached by the 405, 605, and PCH.

Parking: Free parking is available just south of camp in the large harbor parking lot. Make sure to check local signs to ensure you are parked in a free space. Park in the city lot, walk under the 2nd street bridge, and enter where you see the rainbow!

No cars will be allowed within Marine Landing. Please do not drive up to the entry gate to drop off your campers. Appian Way is a one-way street, and parking temporarily will block traffic. Any vehicles parked outside our gates will be asked to move prior to checking in their campers. Caregivers must accompany their campers to check-in.

Camp Check-In and Check-Out

Monday Morning Check-In: Please anticipate staying for 10-15 minutes during check-in on your camper's first day of camp while we ensure they are clear to enter camp and join their unit.

Health Screenings: Campers must have a completed CampDoc health profile and prescreening questionnaire to enter camp. All campers will undergo head checks for lice. Campers will not be permitted to enter camp if lice are detected, but may return at any point with proof of service from a lice treatment provider. If a camper is exhibiting symptoms of illness, they may not be permitted to enter camp.

Medications: Camper medications taken during the camp day must be reported to their CampDoc profile. Please check in camper medications with our Health & Inclusion Specialist upon arrival. Campers at anaphylactic risk are required to have an epi-pen with them to enter camp.

Camper Check-In: Check-in starts at 8:30am and runs until 9:00am every morning. We will be checking all campers in on the rainbow path in our driveway through CampDoc. Once checked in, a staff member will direct each camper to their unit. Caregivers will be asked to remain in the check-in area, not entering the main campgrounds unless necessary and permitted by staff.

Late Check-In: Campers can be dropped off at camp at any time. Once you've arrived, please ring the gate doorbell or call our camp line at 562-430-3077, and a staff member will meet you for check-in at our **Green Gate** (see map).

Extended Before Care: Extended Before Care (AM Care) is available each day beginning at 7:00 am for an additional fee of \$30 per week. During this time, campers will be under supervision of staff with the option to participate in continued camp activities including crafts, games, and shared time with friends.

Camper Check-Out: Check-out begins at 4:00pm and runs until 4:30pm every afternoon. The check-out procedure is the same as check-in except caregivers must bring a valid ID and be on the "Trusted Contacts" list in CampDoc for us to release the camper. Once checked out, a staff member will direct each camper from their unit to the exit. Campers not picked up before 4:30 pm will be given one day of grace before being automatically enrolled in Extended After Care for the week at a charge of \$30.

Early Check-Out: If you know in advance that your campers will need to be picked up early, please add them to our Early Check-Out List at that morning's check-in or email us at marinelandingstaff@girlscoutsla.org. Once you've

arrived, please ring the gate doorbell or call our camp line at 562-430-3077, and a staff member will meet you at our **Green Gate** (see map). Early pick-ups between 3:45-4:00 pm will be asked to head to general check-out at 4pm to ensure our afternoon flag ceremony goes uninterrupted.

Extended After Care: Extended After Care (PM Care) is available each day until 6:00 pm for an additional fee of \$30 per week. During this time, campers will be under supervision of staff with the option to participate in continued camp activities including crafts, games, and shared time with friends.

Extended Program (Late Night): Every other Thursday evening (Sessions 2, 4, 6, 8, and 10) at Marine Landing we extend the program day for our older campers (grades 4-8). Late Night runs from 4pm-7pm. This program typically includes extra time on the water, dinner and dessert, and a fun activity.

CampDoc.com

To collect health history and medical care information, GSGLA uses CampDoc.com, a secure, encrypted, and password protected electronic health record system for camps. You must complete your camper's CampDoc.com health history by the Thursday before your camper's session.

New Campers: If you are a new camper with us, you should receive an email directly from campdoc.com within two weeks of registering for camp to login and create a profile for your camper. CampDoc will also email you reminders until your camper's profile is 100% completed.

Returning Campers: If you are a returning camper, you should already have your login credentials. You can log in at any time after registering for camp sessions to update your information. CampDoc will also email you reminders until your camper's profile is 100% completed.


Photo Release: Your camper will only be photographed if the photo release in CampDoc has been signed. Photos taken at camp will be uploaded in a photo drive shared with all guardians and may be featured on camp social media/marketing materials.

Buddy Requests: Campers will be placed in units based on grade level for the upcoming school year.

Health Forms: Please complete your camper's CampDoc Health Profile to the best of your ability. Our Health & Inclusion Specialist reviews each camper's profile prior to their start of camp. They will follow up with the caregiver if requested or for more information if needed. A caregiver signature is required in the over-the-counter medication authorization section. We will reference this authorization if any first aid needs are brought to our attention and only distribute authorized medications.



Trusted Contacts: Anyone picking up a camper must be listed in the Trusted Contacts section of your CampDoc profile. All Trusted Contacts must have either a photo uploaded to CampDoc or bring a valid form of photo ID for Marine Landing to release a camper. Even if you are the user on the account, you will have to add yourself as a Trusted Contact.



Camper Behavior

We are committed to providing a physically and emotionally safe environment at camp.

Campers will be expected to:

- Follow the safety rules of camp
- Respect staff, other campers, and themselves
- Respect property of the camp and of other campers
- Follow the Girl Scout Promise and Law

Disruptive, destructive, or dangerous behavior by campers will not be tolerated. Such behavior will result in the camper being removed from the activity. If the behavior continues, the camper will be dismissed from camp. Refunds will not be issued to campers dismissed for unacceptable behavior.

Campers will be dismissed immediately for:

- Endangering the health or safety of others
- Teasing, bullying, or abusing other campers or staff
- Violence of any kind

Camper Health

First Aid: Marine Landing keeps a supply of over-the-counter medication to treat simple complaints such as bug bites, headache, mild upset stomach, menstrual cramps, etc. You do not need to send any medications for these health reasons. Campers will only be given medications authorized on their CampDoc profile.

CampDoc Health Notes: Anytime a camper comes to us with a mild illness or injury, our staff are required to log a health note to the camper's CampDoc Health profile documenting the incident and any medical attention received. Once a health note is submitted, an email notification will be sent to the address linked to the camper's CampDoc account.

Severe Illness or Injury: Camp staff are CPR/AED/First Aid certified. In case of emergency, staff will respond accordingly and contact the camper's parent/guardian/emergency contact immediately.

What to Bring to Camp

Clothing & Towel: We will be getting wet daily, so please have campers arrive in their bathing suit and bring a towel. Board shorts, rash guards, hats, and other sun coverage for non-water activities are recommended.

Shoes: Closed-toe water shoes must be worn by all participants. Other shoes, such as flip flops, may be worn to and from Marine Landing, but once we begin water activities all campers will be asked to change shoes. If a camper does not have proper footwear, they will not be able to participate in water activities. We have a small number of donated pairs for those who forget, but quantity and size are limited.



Sunscreen: Campers should come to camp with sunscreen applied and enough sunscreen to reapply during designated times throughout the day. Campers are expected to be able to apply their own sunscreen.

Lunch: Campers are responsible for bringing their own lunch. Your camper is welcome to bring a small lawn chair to sit in during lunch.

Snacks (Optional): Morning and afternoon snacks will be provided for campers each day. A snack menu will be included in your welcome email. Please note that we will do our best to accommodate dietary restrictions. Campers are welcome to bring their own snacks.

Water: We encourage reusable water bottles to stay hydrated and help the environment.

Medications: Please report all current medications on your camper's CampDoc Health Profile. Medications to be taken at camp must be checked in with our Health & Inclusion Specialist on Monday morning.

Smart Devices: Phones and smart watches are not allowed during camp activities. If you find it necessary for your camper to have a smart device at camp, it must be put away during camp hours. This includes the use of phones as cameras, so please bring a separate camera if your camper would like to capture camp memories.

Please do not bring toys or anything that may be lost or forgotten. GSGLA is not responsible for lost/damaged items.

If you believe your camper left an item at camp, please email marinelandingcamp@girlscoutsla.org to inquire. Any items found at camp will be stored until August 28th.

Water Safety and Quality

Lifeguards: Our staff are lifeguard certified through the American Red Cross and complete ongoing skills practice weekly as recommended by the American Red Cross. Staff are trained in best practices to help give campers the confidence and skills to build their swimming and boating abilities.

Monday Swim Evaluation: On Monday, campers will go through a water and boating safety orientation. Each camper will participate in a swimming evaluation for our staff to determine their ability, however all swimming abilities will participate in all camp programming. Life jackets are mandatory while boating and available for swimming.

Rainfall: Due to Marine Landing's location in Alamitos Bay, bacteria levels can rise outside of safe thresholds up to 72 hours after rainfall. During a rain advisory, boating activities may be possible but swimming will be prohibited. In the event of thunder/lightning, all water activities will be paused for 30 minutes.

Marine Life: While observing marine life is exciting, we have protocols in place to prevent interaction with unpredictable species (such as sea lions) to ensure the safety of our campers and wildlife.

Sewage Spills: Sewage spills are unfortunately becoming a common occurrence. We always follow beach closure recommendations by the City of Long Beach.
